Get Ready for Winter Weather!

We do our absolute best to keep the lights on for our Members year round, but sometimes Mother Nature has other plans.

Here are some tips to stay prepared during the cold-weather months should we have an outage:

Charge it up!- Keep cell phones, backup batteries, kindles, hand-held games, and any other electronics charged.

Stock up! - have enough bottled water,
canned goods and other nonperishable foods, such as trail mix,
jerky, protein bars, etc. on hand for
each person in your household for at
least a couple of days. Don't forget
baby formula for the little ones! And
make sure you have a manual can
opener!

Turn on the weather! Invest in a NOAA
Weather Radio which is battery powered and can give you up-to-date information regarding the conditions in your area. You can also download the app, Clime, which is free and also powered by NOAA.

Stay Safe (and warm!)- Have a stockpile of blankets and warm clothes
should the heat go out. If using an
alternative heating source, make sure
to follow all instructions to avoid fires,
carbon monoxide poisoning, and other
emergencies.

Let there be light!- have candles, flashlights, matches, and extra batteries on hand to see in the dark!

Convenient Ways to Pay Your Bill

Our bills are printed the 28th of every month and are due 20 days from then, putting the due date anywhere from the 17th to the 20th depending on the month. There are several different ways you can pay including:

- 1. By mail- use the courtesy envelope provided with your billing statement and mail it back to us
- 2. By phone- call us during **regular business hours** to pay using bank account or credit card (*NOTE- while our answering service is available 24/7, only the office staff can make or discuss payments)
- 3. Online- visit our website, <u>oneida-madison.coop</u>, in the upper right-hand corner of the home page you can
 - a. Make a One-Time Payment
 - b. Register with SmartHub- which saves your payment information so that you can manually pay every month without having to input credit card information OR sign up for recurring payments
- 4. Drop Box- drop your payment off anytime, day or night, using our drop box on the front of our building.

When the Lights Go Out, We Do Too


Sometimes, despite our best efforts, the power inevitably goes out. One of the main questions we often hear is why? Depicted below is a graph of the outages incurred from January 1, 2022 to November 1, 2022.

In the case of an outage, always call **315-893-1851**. If during regular business hours, your call will be answered by one of our Member Services Representatives who will then dispatch the line crew. Should an outage occur outside of working hours, your call will be directed to our third-party answering service who will then contact the linemen and dispatch them out. We kindly ask that you have your address and service map location (found on your billing statement) on hand, ready to relay to the operators.

Our answering service, while capable of connecting with our crew and passing along information given to them by members, does NOT have access to our computer records including billing information, payment history, or account balances, so please reserve those phone calls for regular business hours.

In the event of an after-hours outage, please remember that our line crew might be called out of their beds, away from their families, sometimes in very severe weather. We understand that outages can be very inconvenient, and in some cases, dangerous, but please be patient when waiting for your lights to come back on.

Introducing Our New Energy Efficiency Rebate Program

Have you purchased an Energy Star-rated appliance recently? You may be eligible for our new Energy Efficiency Rebate Program!!

For qualifying members, you can receive a bill credit applied to your account for up to \$400!

Accepted appliances include refrigerators, freezers, clothes washers, clothes dryers, dishwashers, window air conditioners, and dehumidifiers.

The purchase needs to have been

made *after* June 1, 2022, the member's bill must be in a current status, and the appliance must be Energy Star rated.

Only one appliance per membership is eligible for rebate in a 12-month period. All rebates are subject to the availability of funds.

At Home with Hazel

This Yule Log is surprisingly easy to make and with decadent flavors of chocolate and coffee, its sure to be a showstopper at your next holiday gathering!

Chocolate Yule Log

Prep time: 50 mins Cook time: 10 mins Refrigeration time: 2 hours 15 mins

<u>Ingredients</u>

Buttercream Filling:

1 2/3 C powdered sugar

1/2 C unsalted butter, at room temperature

2 Tbsp coffee-flavored liqueur

1 1/2 Tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder

1 pinch salt

1/3 C mascarpone cheese

Sponge Cake:

2 Tbsp melted butter

1/2 C unsweetened cocoa powder

2 Tbsp all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp kosher salt

5 large eggs, at room temperature

2/3 C granulated sugar

1/2 tsp vanilla extract

2 Tbsp powdered sugar, or as needed

Ganache Frosting:

1 C heavy cream, boiling-hot

1-8 oz package semi-sweet chocolate chips

Directions:

- 1. Make the buttercream filling: whip first 5 ingredients until combined.
- 2. Transfer to a medium bowl and fold in mascarpone until combined. Set aside.
- 3. Preheat oven to 400° F. Prepare a 13x8 rimmed sheet pan for cake: brush melted butter over pan, then line with parchment paper. Brush more butter on top.
- 4. Whisk cocoa, flour & salt in a bowl, breaking up any clumps.
- 5. In a clean bowl, whisk eggs and granulated sugar for 2-3 mins or until fluffy, thick & light in color. Add vanilla and cocoa mixture. Mix until moistened but not fully blended.
- 6. Pour cake batter into prepared pan and spread out with spatula. Tap the pan on the counter to remove any large air bubbles.
- 7. Bake until top is dry and edges start to pull away from sides, 8-10mins.
- 8. While cake is baking, sift powdered sugar onto clean kitchen towel to cover an area slightly larger than the sponge cake.

- Remove cake, run a knife around the edges of the pan. Dust powdered sugar over the top, run spatula under parchment paper to make sure it's not stuck to the pan.
- 10. Quickly flip the pan on top of the sugared area on the towel to invert the cake. Gently roll up the cake in the towel; allow to cool for 15 mins.
- 11. Carefully unroll cooled cake. Dollop buttercream filling and spread to edges. Gently roll cake over the filling. Sprinkle with powdered sugar, then wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate until firm about 2 hours.
- 12. Make ganache: poor hot cream over chocolate chips in a bowl. Let sit for 1 minutes then whisk until smooth.
- 13. Place refrigerated log onto a parchment lined sheet pan. Spread a layer of ganache all over cake except for the swirls on the end. Refrigerate an additional 15 minutes.
- 14. Use the tip of a knife to carve lines into the ganache to create the appearance of tree bark.
- 15. Decorate with berries, mint leaves, or whatever other additions you'd like.
